WEBER COUNTY CELL PHONE SIGN UP FOR EMERGENCY NOTIFICATIONS

The Weber County (Your City) emergency reverse notification system allows emergency officials in (Your city) (and unincorporated county) to notify citizens and businesses in your neighborhood of emergency situations and emergency information. This may include information such as evacuation notifications, missing children alerts, water outages, etc. Our system primarily utilizes the 9-1-1 database for resident and business phone numbers. However, here in Weber County, we recognize that many residents rely on their cell phones/ email for emergency notifications and that many of our residents do not have land line phones in their homes.

You can register up to six (6) phone numbers and up to two (2) email addresses where you would like to receive emergency notifications. It is important to keep this registry current. If you move, change phone numbers, or get a new email address, you must keep your registration current in order to receive emergency information. It is important to keep your information current. Don't forget your password!

Notifications will be sent using a recorded voice message to cell phones, alternate land lines, and/or written messages to email and SMS/text devices. The system is designed to make multiple attempts to connect with lines that are not answered or ring busy. ANNUAL AUDIT REPORT

In January the City's Independent Auditor presented to the Financial Statements for the last fiscal year. The Auditor was very complimentary of the City's financial condition. The City is pleased to pass along some noteworthy highlights from this discussion to our residents and businesses. Harrisville City is one of the rare cities in the state without any outstanding debts, bonds, or loans. Harrisville City also has

one of the lowest property tax rates in the county. Although the City brought in less revenue last year, cuts in expenditures resulted in less spending. Overall, the City ended the last fiscal year with modest gain of \$56,129. This gain was realized notwithstanding the completion of various park and public improvement projects, some of which were matched with grant funds.

Last year several residents requested that the City evaluate its utility fees rather than increase property taxes. In response, city staff conducted an audit of utility fees charged by the city. Some deficiencies were identified and corrected. While revenues are still tight, the city council has set the goal of making a balanced budget this year. Budget planning will soon begin, along with any revenue considerations that may be needed to balance the budget. You are welcome to attend the public meetings and watch, and to give comment during the budget public hearings.
