DEFENDING OUR CHILDREN'S FUTURE

Jennifer Andrushko, a Harrisville mother of a 5 year old identity theft victim, has recently co-founded an organization to protect children's identities called "Defending Our Children's Future." Jennifer's 5 year old son was born a victim of identity theft by being assigned a SSN that was in use illegally for employment purposes in Utah by an illegal alien for 5 years prior to her son's birth. The main purposes of the group are: to raise awareness of this sickening, rampant crime; to provide support for victims; and to unite communities and citizens to petition for the passage of laws and the enforcement of laws to protect our children's identities. In Utah alone, it is estimated that 50,000 children are victims of identity theft, most of which are unaware of the crime as you are not notified of employment-related child identity theft unless you are receiving or applying for government aid. There are 1,626 Utah companies that were found to be paying wages to the SSNs of children under the age of 13 on public assistance. This crime is being justified and ignored by some in the legislature and media and in most cases there is little prosecution.
