mid all of the unexpected events that are taking place around us, with COVID-19 and an earthquake last week, Harrisville City remains the wonderful community we all love to live in. In an abundance of caution, we made adjustments to our spring events and schedules and encourage you to align with the increasing regulations to ensure the health and safety of our community. These adjustments include cancelation of the following events:

- Annual Easter Egg Hunt
- Baseball and Softball Spring Season
- All Cabin and Bowery Reservations through May
- Any public gathering of more than 10 healthy people

Although these events have been canceled, I want to assure you we are continuing to provide the services you are accustomed to and rely on. Harrisville Police Department remains open 24/7 and will respond with extra precaution. Harrisville Public Works Department is regularly checking and maintaining our utility services. The City Offices remain open in a limited capacity. Please call 801-782-4100 rather than seeking help in person. Please note even though parks are open for people to enjoy, restrooms and drinking fountains are closed. Garbage service will continue as usual, the irrigation season will begin normally, sewer services are working (Please just do not flush items

that clog it), and Bona Vista water is safe to drink and use.

1) EXERCISE RESTRAINT

2) REFRAIN FROM IMPULSE OR PANIC PURCHASES

Your impulse purchase might be what someone else actually needs for tonight.





3) BE SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE

Social media posts of long lines, empty shelves, and wait times at stores induce more community anxiety and panic.

4) IDENTIFY WAYS TO HELP YOUR NEIGHBORS, ESPECIALLY THOSE WHO ARE MORE VULNERABLE TO INFECTION





5) GO ABOUT YOUR NORMAL LIFE

Most importantly, do the things you would normally do while focusing on the CDC's steps to prevent illness — for example: play at a park, walk along the trail, sing in the rain, read a book, watch a movie, make dinner with a loved one — do what you would normally do (but keep washing your hands a few more times while doing it).

By taking these steps as a community, we can better navigate this evolving situation together.
